

What is a National Park?

National Parks in Korea are the areas that represent the natural ecosystem and the cultural assets of the Republic of Korea. They are declared and managed by the government of Korea in order to protect the areas and ensure Sustainable Use. The Inje National Park Service was established in 1981 to make professional management of this park, and it is in charge of 21 of the 22 national parks.

Northeastern National Park

Newengsan National Park consists of Newengsan, Bengawan, and Bawean districts. Bengawan (Beng white, Am. rock) consists of Banjungwangi Peak (741 m), the highest peak, Sagiringo Peak (702 m), Sibukting Peak (611 m) which looks like a white crane spreading wings, and Bismarck Forest which is designated as a natural monument.

Chubukkyang - Spring Biseokyang, best describes the beautiful scenery of Cherry blossoms with fresh green colors of the mountain. In autumn, the adorable little Subok's Maple leaves change color. These are some of the many reasons why Baksungsan Temple has visitors every season.

Founded during the reign of King Mu of the Zhou Dynasty (1046 BC), Taiyuanjiao Temple is one of the last three Wei-earthen-Spiral, Lu Monastic Practice Centers, according to legend, a white sheep was reborn after listening to "Buddhism," a white sheep.

Maple trees around Baekyangsa Temple change with yellow Ginkgo Trees, Green Bee Trees, and Persimmon Trees and deepen the autumn mood. Gobulsa (Gu-jeo, bell of Buddha, Mar, Cherry Blossom), located in Baekyangsa temple, is the one of the 10th most famous Cherry Blossoms of the Hwangm region which has been there about 300 years. The pink flowers of Gobulsa bloom every March and its delicate scent certainly adds more of the aromas of the Hwangm region.
